

## 2026 Parent Payment Letter from School Council

Dear Parents and Carers.

Mentone Primary School is looking forward to another wonderful year of teaching and learning in 2026. We are writing to inform you of our voluntary financial contributions for next year. Attached are details of the parent payment arrangements and stationery packs.

While schools provide free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum, voluntary contributions from families enable us to enhance our programs and learning environment. Thanks to your ongoing generosity, we have been able to:

- Employ a part-time maintenance person to support the upkeep of our grounds
- Purchase and maintain air conditioning units
- Refurbish classrooms, the library, and gardens, and renew the oval surface
- Expand art materials and sports equipment
- Continue resourcing literacy and library books

Without these contributions, many of these valued resources and programs would be at risk.

Our families understand that these contributions directly support high-quality programs and strong learning outcomes. Mentone Primary School's curriculum goes well beyond the 'standard', as reflected in our 2025 NAPLAN results. Examples include:

- A strong focus on student wellbeing, with explicit teaching of social-emotional learning, in-school counsellors, Play Leaders, therapy dog Kouta, and our partnership with Story Dogs.
- Specialist classes in Auslan, Library, PE, STEM, and Visual Art taught by expert teachers.
- Targeted intervention and extension programs, supported by 1.73 staff members dedicated to Literacy, Numeracy, and Wellbeing/Inclusion, plus our ongoing (non-DE funded) tutoring program.
- Learning Specialist-led enrichment groups for high-achieving students.
- A wide range of incursions and special activities that enrich learning through real-world experiences.

The Curriculum Contribution for 2026 is \$417.95 (\$1.15 per day, per student). Schools are no longer permitted to offer early payment discounts.

## **ONE PAGE OVERVIEW**



## FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

## PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

## Curriculum **Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

## Other **Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

## **Extra-Curricular Items** and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.
